Government of Canada Invests in Research for Canada's Fertilizer Industry

March 27, 2015 – Maxville, ON – Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC)

Parliamentary Secretary Pierre Lemieux, on behalf of Agriculture Minister Gerry Ritz, announced today an investment of up to \$1.1 million to the Canadian Fertilizer Institute. The investment will enable research and development to help improve the efficient use of fertilizer, while reducing the environmental impacts and input costs, and creating competitive advantages for producers through improved crop production.

It will also enable the Canadian Fertilizer Institute to build on its successful 4R Nutrient Stewardship Research Network. A cross-Canada research network involving scientists from 11 universities and research institutes will collaborate on a three-year research project to develop and test best management practices and support systems for fertilizer use tailored to Canadian soils, climates and cropping systems.

- The Canadian fertilizer industry contributes over \$12 billion annually to the Canadian economy and is one of the world's largest producers and exporters of fertilizer. Canada supplies approximately 12 per cent of the world's fertilizer materials and is the largest exporter of potash and elemental sulfur.
- This investment is being made through Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's Agrilnnovation Program, a five-year, up to \$698 million initiative under *Growing Forward 2*.
- The Canadian Fertilizer Institute (CFI), located in Ontario, is a not-for profit
 industry organization that represents manufacturers, wholesale and retail
 distributors of nitrogen, phosphate and potash fertilizers. As the unified voice of
 the Canadian fertilizer industry, CFI promotes safe, responsible, and sustainable,
