The goal of the **Greener World** program is to educate consumers about how to fertilize lawns and gardens responsibly by following the 4Rs of fertilizer use: the **Right Source** of fertilizer at the **Right Rate**, the **Right Time** and the **Right Place**.

Right Source –
read the bag before
you buy to ensure
you are using the
right fertilizer for
your lawn






Right Rate – know the size of your lawn, only buy what you need and apply following recommendations on the bag. A good quality fertilizer spreader can help with proper application



Right Time — don't apply fertilizer if the ground is frozen or right before an expected rainfall. Spring and Fall are the most important times to fertilize

Right Place – sweep any fertilizer that lands on hard surfaces back onto the lawn. Don't apply near ponds, streams, rivers or lakes, or alternatively use a low phosphorous or phosphorus-free fertilizer on established lawns



If you are left with extra fertilizer at the end of the season you can **store it, use it, or share it.**



Store any leftover fertilizer sealed in its original container in a dry place for use next season. **Share** by giving it to a neighbour, a relative or donate it to a community group.

Nutrients contained in fertilizer, compost and manure have to be used with care to protect our water and air.

Simple tips such as getting gardeners to carefully follow the directions on fertilizer bags will help to ensure a healthier, greener world.
